The Ridiculous Rhyme Show is coming

On Tuesday 28th May, members of [The Ridiculous Rhyme Show](#), a UK show aimed at making literacy fun for children, will be coming to Essex Heights. The aim of the show is to engage children using interactive performance and comedy. It encourages children to enjoy literacy through creative word play which can be carried back into the classroom following the visit. The one hour presentation will be for all children from Prep to Year 6.

Following the show, the Years 5 and 6 students will each be involved in a TV workshop, which will be an opportunity for them to gain an insight into the media industry and the variety of career paths within it. The team will create their own production studio within the hall and assign students job roles before filming a few scenes. After the workshop they will conduct a question and answer session for the children.

This is a very exciting opportunity and we are one of the few schools in Victoria that will be fortunate enough for the team to visit the school. Parents are more than welcome to attend on the day.

NAPLAN

The National Assessment Program - Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) involves students in Years 3 and 5 from all states and territories in Australia. NAPLAN testing will take place on Tuesday 14 May, Wednesday 15 May and Thursday 16 May. Students' will be assessed on their skills in reading, writing, language conventions (spelling, punctuation and grammar) and numeracy. These national test results provide information on how your child is progressing and performing in the key areas of literacy and numeracy and help to support improvements in teaching to benefit your child. Teachers have been working with their classes to prepare them for NAPLAN. Please remember that NAPLAN is only an assessment in one point of time and complements all the other valuable assessments carried out by classroom teachers on a regular basis.

You can support your children to be ready to participate in these assessments by making a smooth, calm start to each day. Simple tasks such as ensuring that your child has breakfast before coming to school and that children arrive to school on time can make a big difference. Two correct answers can be the difference between medium growth and high growth, so a good start to the day and **plenty of sleep throughout the week** can be enough to help your child achieve their best.

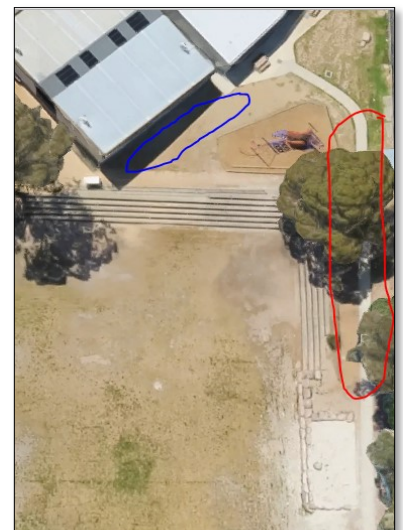

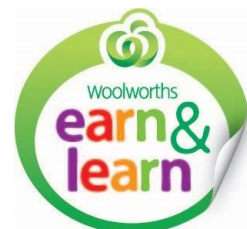

In previous years ICAS have been paper assessments, however the Reach Assessments will be entirely online.

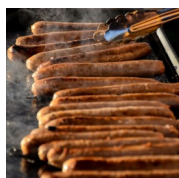

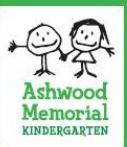

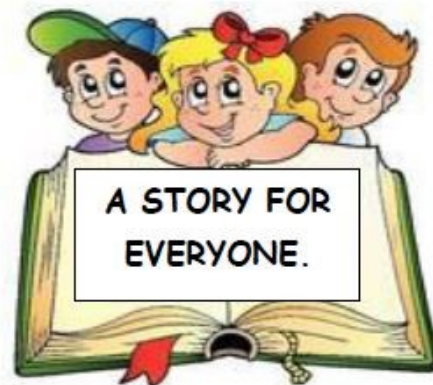
