## PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Dear parents and friends of our Essex Heights community,

### Term 3 ... a busy and very productive term at Essex Heights

As this term draws to a close it is worth reflecting on the amazing work that has been accomplished by students and staff. Sometimes when we reflect upon busy, we think of extra curricular activities, however I would like to focus on the core business of children learning. Throughout this year the staff have spent many hours working together in professional learning to ensure that the school is providing the most contemporary and engaging teaching practice so that all of our children can reach their fullest potential. In semester 1 there was a strong focus on literacy but in semester 2 the focus changed to how we best teach mathematics. ## Principal's Report

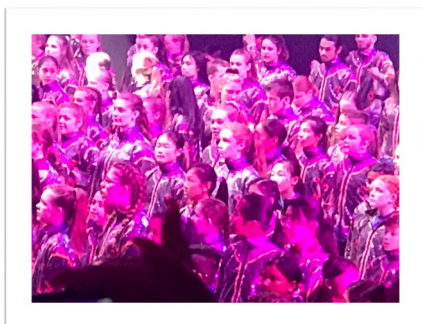

### Compassion

### Year 6 Transition Program: My Values

This week in ArtSEL, we focused on helping students to learn how to identify personal values that influence behaviour, and how they apply to social dilemmas.

What the students learnt:

- ★ Everything you think and everything you feel is because of the values and beliefs you hold.
- ★ A value is something you think is more important than anything else.
- ★ You may not be aware of it but your values shape what you do and your decisions shape your life. That means values guide behaviour. They allow us to make choices about how we behave.
- ★ They also give us choices when emotions and stresses swamp our thinking and we are unsure of what to do.
- ★ Knowing our values gives us power over being too reactive.
- ★ Other values in part define who we are and who we become.

The students discussed a range of personal values and then picked five of their top personal values to help them understand what they believe in and stand for.

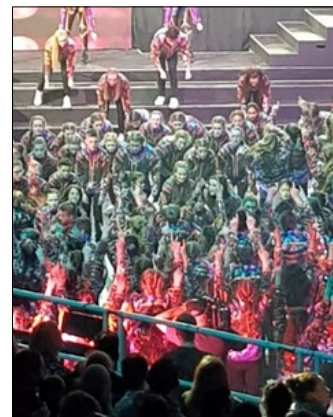

## Health Centre



### Children with Food Allergies

Essex Heights Primary School has a number of children who suffer from severe life threatening food allergies known as Anaphylaxis.

Any food can cause anaphylaxis but generally these foods account for 90% of reactions: Peanuts, Tree Nuts, Shellfish, Fish, Milk, Egg, Sesame, Soy and Wheat.

We also have a large number of children with other various food allergies.

Any food brought into the school can have serious consequences to children at risk. We ask parents, students and staff to be sensitive to the critical needs of these children at school who have severe food allergies.

Due to the large number of children with nut allergies, we request that nuts, foods that contain nuts and nut products such as Nutella and peanut butter are not consumed at school at any time.



If food is brought in to share for a birthday or special occasion, please speak to the teacher and provide the teacher with a printed list of ingredients before distributing.

Parents of children with food allergies may choose to provide an alternative "treat" to be kept with the class teacher for these occasions.

## Before & After School Care

### September Vacation Care Program

The September Vacation Care Program is out now and enrolments are being taken. We have limited spaces available so we may not be able to accommodate care requests.



Please keep the following in mind if you wish to access the September Vacation Care Program:



1. The program operates between 7.00am and 6.00pm.
2. If your child/children is collected after 6.00pm, you will be charged late fees, which are charged at \$1.00 per minute, per child. (This also applies to Aftercare).
3. If you want to cancel your booking for the September Vacation Care Program, it must be done before 6.00pm on Friday 20th September. Any cancellations after this time will incur full charges unless accompanied by a doctor's certificate.
4. We are unable to accept Vacation Care enrolments over the phone or via email.
5. Please ensure that you inform the program if a third party is collecting your child. You will need to provide the program with the third parties name, address and phone number. They will need to present a photo identification to staff on collection of your child/children. We are unable to allow children to leave the program by themselves or with a person that is not endorsed by the parents/legal guardian.
6. After two months of not using the program your CCS funding will automatically cease. You will need to contact me to reinstate your funding. Once this is done you will need to go into your myGov account and confirm that you are the legal guardian of your child/children. Once these steps are completed, your CCS funding will be reinstated.
7. Booked Vacation Care or Curriculum Day enrolments are not transferrable to other families.
