Dear Parents and Carers in the Essex Heights Community,

### Building connections

Connections matter. Strong ties with family, friends and the community provide us with happiness, security, support and a sense of purpose. Being connected to others is important for our mental and physical wellbeing and can be a protective factor against anxiety and depression. At school, teachers have been very mindful of continuing to re-establish, strengthen and extend the children's connections in their classrooms, across their year level and into the community beyond. Some lovely examples of this are our on-line School Assemblies, the Year 5 'at school' camp and our whole school's participation in the Australia-wide 'Music: Count Us In'.

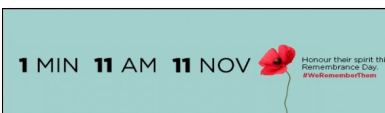

Please note that the survey will time out after 60 minutes of inactivity.

The survey results will be reported back to our school community through the 2020 Annual Report. We look forward to your feedback so that we can continue to make our school the best it can be for the benefit of all our children.

## Parents visiting the school & students leaving early

Parents/guardians are reminded of the current protocols about visiting the school. If, for example, you are delivering an item your child has forgotten and requires during the day (e.g. water bottle, lunch, hat), or you are collecting them early (e.g. for an appointment), **do not enter the school grounds**; you must:

1. Wait at the front gates in Essex Road.
2. Phone the Office on 9807 4944.
3. Staff will come out to the gate to collect an item, or send your child out to you if leaving early.

This protocol remains in place for the time being for the health and wellbeing of our school and the wider community, and we appreciate your assistance in following this procedure.

It is sometimes necessary for **students to leave school early**. With the current protocols in place, we've noticed that some parents are not entering an absence note in Compass, haven't advised their child's teacher about the early departure, and that some child go straight to their parents when they see them waiting at the gate and forget to come to the Office to be signed out. Signing them out of school is an important step in our duty of care to your child. Please follow these simple steps to ensure that your child can be collected from school efficiently if they need to leave early:

1. Enter an absence note on Compass (preferably the day before).
2. Email your child's teacher using the link in Compass **before the end of the previous school day** to advise them about the early departure, and they can send your child to the Office ready to be signed out. NOTE: if you email on the day of the departure, we can't guarantee your child's teacher will have seen the message, so phone the Office as early in the day as possible.
3. On your arrival at school, wait at the front gates in Essex Road.
4. Phone the Office on 9807 4944.
5. Office staff will sign your child out, and send them out to meet you. Please check with your child **before** leaving that they have been to the Office to sign out of school.

## Year 2 Indigenous Art Incursion

We are very fortunate to have secured the services of indigenous artist, Simone Thomson, to work with the Year 2 students on Wednesday 18th November as part of our building community through art.

Simone is a Melbourne based self-taught artist and descendant of Victoria's Ulupna and Moira Clans of the Yorta-Yorta Tribe, and the Yarra-Yarra Clan of the Wurundjeri Tribe. She draws inspiration for her art through her deep spiritual connection to country and the rich colours and textures of the earth and sky, the sources of many dreamtime stories.

Simone will hold a one hour session with each Year 2 class in the Art Room. The learning intention of the session is to provide the students with the opportunity to gain valuable knowledge of local indigenous culture and art. It is also intended that this session will stimulate the Year 2 students to develop an indigenous inspired design. Over the following art sessions with Mr Hudson, the Year 2 students will transfer their designs in the school grounds using outdoor paint.

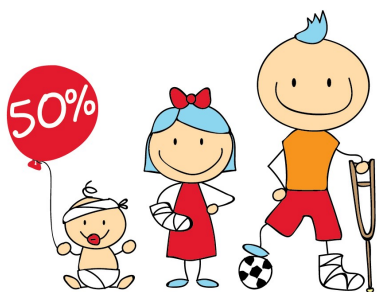

## In Flanders Fields

poem by Lieutenant Colonel John McCrae, 3 May 1915

In Flanders fields the poppies blow  
Between the crosses, row on row,
