## Principal's Report

### Prep 100 Days of School

**Prep to Year 2:** Classroom teachers are reading books in class and keeping a record of book titles read, and will receive a Participation Certificate for listening to 30 books read in class. They will also receive a Principal's Challenge Reading Certificate if they read 30 books at home (take home readers can be included); these must be recorded on the record sheet provided.

**Years 3 to 6:** Read a minimum of five novels independently to be eligible to receive a Principal's Reading Challenge Certificate; record the details on the provided record sheet.

All students have received the Principal's Reading Challenge information and record sheet. Record the details of the books read and return the completed sheet to your classroom teacher by Friday 6th September.

### Being Assertive

In ArtSEL this week, we are learning to be assertive. Being assertive helps you communicate what you need or want in a way that is respectful towards friends and adults in school. We do this by looking people in the eye, having our shoulders back and using a strong and confident voice. Being assertive is different from being passive or aggressive. When you are passive, you are shy and nervous about communicating what you need or want. When you are aggressive, you are often demanding and not thinking about other people's perspective. This week, try practising being assertive. It's a skill you can use when solving problems, asking for help, standing up for yourself or others, and making friends.



### Year 6 Transition Program

This week in the ArtSEL Transition Program, the Year 6 students were involved in a Peer Supported Transition initiative established by Gateway LLEN. This one hour program links Essex Heights Year 6 students with selected Year 8 students from Mount Waverley Secondary College (MWSC). The selected MWSC students will facilitate general discussions around their own transitional experiences. The activity is set up as a circle time discussion that allows children to explore and address issues which concern them regarding transition to secondary school and will debunk some of the common fears and misconceptions.

The Year 8 Mount Waverley students have been trained to discuss and alleviate fears and concerns about the transition experience. This is particularly useful as they have already gone through the transition process and can respond to concerns and questions in the same language.

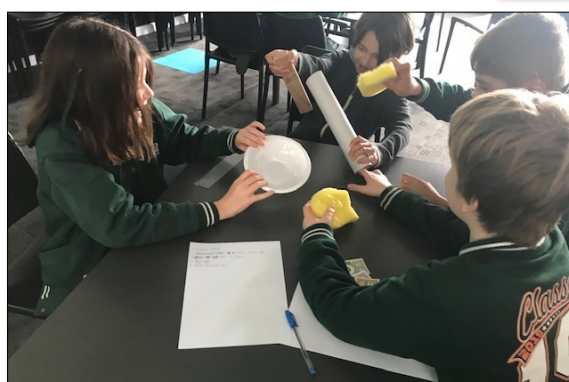
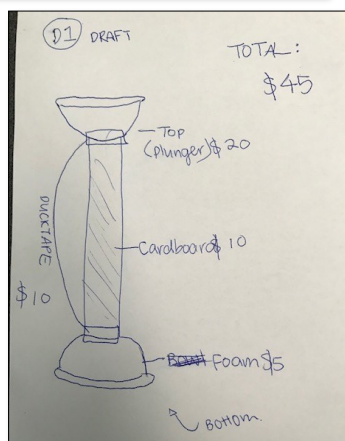
- What do engineers do?

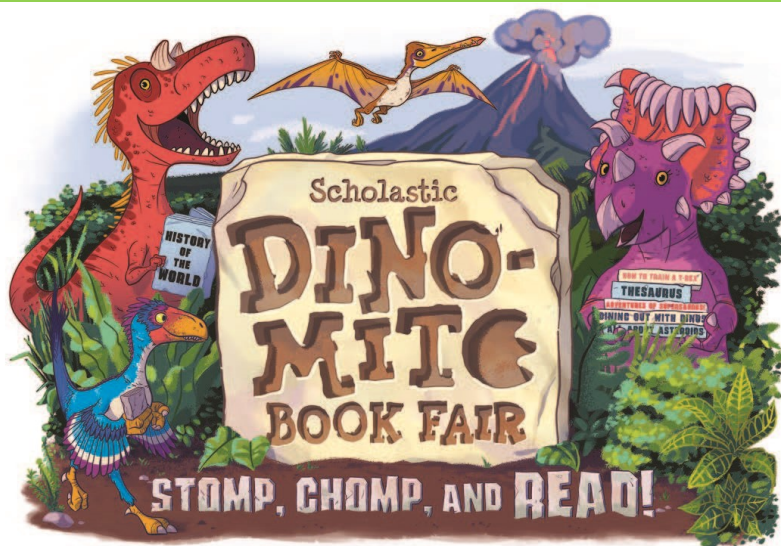

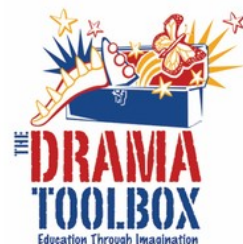
