PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Dear parents and friends of our Essex Heights community,

Christchurch Tragedy

As I listened and read about the terrible shootings in Christchurch a week ago, I was shocked and saddened by the enormity of this inexcusable behaviour. It caused me to reflect on what we value as a school and society. Australia is proudly a multicultural country that values and celebrates the many different nationalities that make up our vibrant country. At Essex Heights we too celebrate diversity as we did on Thursday for Harmony Day, and as we indeed do every day.



Sadly there are individuals in our society that promote fear and intolerance. This is totally unacceptable, and is counter to the values and expectations of our country and our school. At Essex Heights we will celebrate the richness of our diversity, and we will put into practice our school values that promote our inclusiveness and diversity. Three of our five school values are directly linked to this expectation: ***inclusiveness, friendliness and respect*** which form the building blocks of acceptance, tolerance, pride and celebration of the rich cultures in our school.

I hope that as our children are immersed into our culture, values and expectations, we can continue to produce responsible, well rounded young people that will take their place in our society and be voices to ensure that racism, intolerance and fear are eliminated from our countries rhetoric.

*Everyone celebrates Harmony Day,
Diversity, acceptance in every way.
We're all together standing as one,
The number of people excluded is none.
Moving forward, always together,
respecting each other today and forever.*

Around the school: 4R are writing poems!!

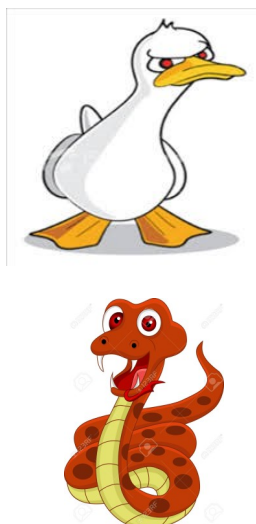

Order envelopes for each student and sibling envelopes for families with two or more children enrolled at EHPS were distributed; all orders were due yesterday, Thursday 21st March. Late orders can be accepted up until 9.00am on Monday morning.

Please note the following about ordering photos:

- All orders (individual student and sibling) must be returned to school **no later than 9.00am on Monday, 25th March.**
- Each student was provided with a personalised order envelope.
- Sibling photo orders (order envelope provided for each family with two or more students at EHPS) are to be returned in the provided Siblings Only order envelope; staple/paper clip to eldest student's individual photo order envelope - **DO NOT** put inside individual student envelope. Online orders for sibling photos close at 8.30am on Monday; cash payment can be accepted until 9.30am on Monday; phone orders close today, Friday 22nd March.
- Payment methods:
 - Online - our preferred method of payment - [click here](#) or type www.theschoolphotographer.com.au into your web browser, and enter the purple code from your child's order envelope; record the online receipt number on your envelope and return to the classroom teacher.
 - Cash - enclose CORRECT MONEY as no change is available.
 - Money Order - all Money Orders are to be made payable to The School Photographer.
- Photo order envelopes are to be handed to the classroom teacher, not the Office.
- Please ensure correct and clear details are written on your child's envelope.
- Late Orders: Any orders placed after school photographs have been delivered to the school will incur a \$15.00 handling fee (includes postage).

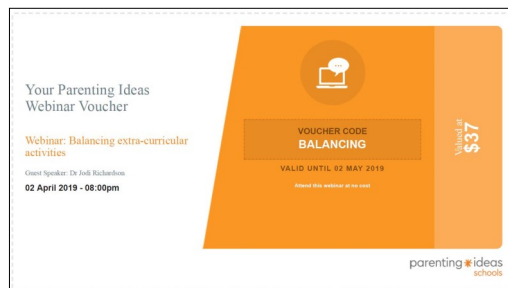
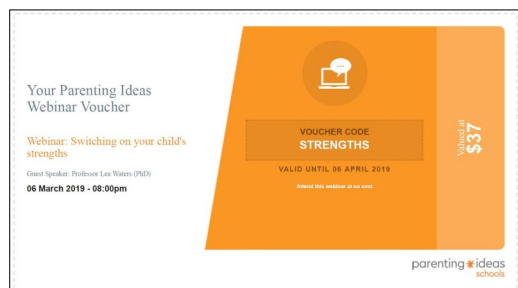

Mangahigh Mathematics Competition

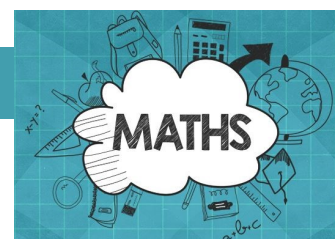


MANGAHIGH

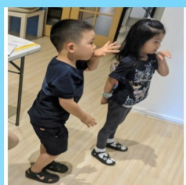

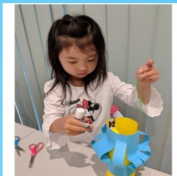
