Recently you will have heard in the media that Victoria has excelled in the NAPLAN achievement of the students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9. The results were the best in Australia and the Minister of Education hailed the results as 'incredible' and a credit to the resilience of students, families, and their schools. Victoria achieved the highest results in 7 out of the 10 measures in primary schools. The Victorian Year 3 and Year 5 results were the best in the country.

At Essex Heights, we are also very pleased with the remarkable achievement of our students, given the difficult COVID-19 years that they have experienced. In every area, our school has surpassed the state scores and in fact in many cases achieved our best results for many years. This is a testament to the amazing work that the children have done while in Remote and Flexible Learning, the fabulous work of our teachers and support staff to maintain the Literacy and Numeracy focus and to you the families that have supported your children in so many ways so that they could prosper in this most tumultuous time.

At Essex Heights we have a key focus to improve our children's Literacy and Numeracy outcomes as part of our School Strategic Plan. Following the completion of our school review and the subsequent Strategic Plan development in 2018, we have made the professional learning of teachers, in these two areas, the highest priority. We have engaged world leading educators such as Michael Ymer in Mathematics to work alongside staff, impart knowledge and refine our practice so that all staff are able to provide the best possible education for our children.
